We no longer have the strength for sorrow, bitterness, or tears. Instead, we must seek to inspire, uplift, and encourage.

After all of the suffering the Jewish People have endured, especially during the Holocaust, we have become refined to the point that we can immediately begin serving G-d with joy.

We are now right before the time of Moshiach, which is compared to Shabbos. Shabbos (and even the hours leading up to it) is a time of joy, when we are forbidden to mourn or cry. Similarly, we are now so close to Moshiach that we must be only joyful.
